Florida man becomes first person with Down syndrome to finish Ironman triathlon

Chris Nikic became the first athlete with Down syndrome to complete an Ironman Triathlon. The 21-year-old from Maitland, Florida earned himself <u>Guinness World Record</u> for the finishing race and his milestone was considered a <u>"historic achievement"</u> by the Special Olympics.



minutes and nine seconds during <u>Ironman Florida</u> in Panama City Beach on Saturday and finished 14 minutes before the official cut-off time. Nikic competed along with his guide, Dan Grieb.

Nikic reflected on the milestone on Instagram and set his sights for more next year. "Goal set and achieved," Nikic wrote Sunday. "Time to set a new and BIGGER Goal for 2021."
